Our support for Street Life in 2024 culminated with a big celebration when a small group of children from the school council, accompanied by their parents, joined the Street Life team on Saturday evening in Brunswick Square, Bristol. One hundred quests were served, and we were able to entertain them with Christmas carols as they queued for hot food, soup, drinks, sandwiches, cakes toiletries, and clothes. One of the guests was a 79-year-old man who was cold, tired, and visibly struggling. He was provided with the resources he needed, including a warm winter coat, perhaps one that once belonged to someone from our school community. Thank you for the support you have provided with the coat donation initiative that the school council has run this term.

The children also took turns serving the soup they and their Year Six classmates had made. The children talked with the guests and they all demonstrated the Tutshill school vision and values in action.



The Street Life leader for the evening wrote: "I was so pleased at how everyone got on so well together, how much our guests appreciated the carols, and what a lovely atmosphere it helped create. The school children were so nice, so polite, and so engaged. I loved how they made up an interpretive dance to the carols and that they got the opportunity to work in teams to serve the soup they made."

We are also incredibly grateful to the cooks, Zoe and Lou, who have supported us with our soup making and to Lou's mum, who knitted 15 beautiful, warm bobble hats. The hats were distributed during a 'walkabout' to reach those living on the streets around Bristol, and I am sure they will provide warmth and comfort for those most in need.
