School Attendance

This term we have had a school visit from our local authority inclusion officer, Brian Gazzard, who conducted a full audit of attendance at the school. As a result of this audit, he has identified three main areas of concern:

- 1. The number of holiday requests
- 2. Lateness before registration
- 3. Attendance issues within year groups

Please can we remind parents that school starts at 8.45am. When children arrive after 8.45 am they are missing the introduction to the first lesson of the day which is phonics in the hub and reading in years 2 to 6. Any arrival after 9.15am is classed as an unauthorised absence but all late marks are recorded and the number of minutes late is also noted. This academic year there have been 763 late marks and 89 late marks after the registers have closed. Our registers download attendance information directly to the local authority who will now be monitoring all lateness, holiday requests and attendance. We have been advised to issue penalty notices and notices to improve to support an improvement in these issues. As a school the last thing we want to do is to issue fines and notices to improve but we must follow the guidance the local authority issues.

Can we politely remind you that term time leave is discouraged and holidays are generally not authorised, unless in extenuating circumstances. There has been a huge increase in requests for term time leave and therefore some children are missing large chunks of schooling. In future, parents and families will be asked to school to discuss their children's attendance should it not be satisfactory. In certain cases, the school will seek advice and guidance from the local authority, especially should your child's attendance sit below 90%. We are very aware of the illnesses and, of course, the reasons for absence will be taken into consideration.
