It was lovely to see the group thinking about new ways to draw things, adding to their creative tool kits. Week 4 was collage, each attendee received a pick and mix bag of collage ingredients and had to come up with a way to present their bits and bring them all together into an original composition, it was fab seeing their imaginations at work and lots of bargaining for different pieces too!
