School Admission Appeals Panel Members



The children are already very keen to win the best class attendance award! Please can we take this opportunity to remind parents that school starts at 8:45am. Any pupil

arriving after this time will be recorded as late on the register. If a child arrives after 9:15am, they will be recorded as having an unauthorised absence. If a child regularly arrives late, they will miss the same lesson or lessons, which will not only impact their attainment—as each lesson in our Reading, Maths, and English schemes builds on the previous one—but also affect their self-esteem and confidence.

- Friday: Year One and Year Two


Autumn Term Two Clubs


