Dear Parents and Carers,

It's hard to believe that we are at the end of Summer 1, meaning we only one term away from the end of the academic year. This term has flown buy with lots of exciting activities taking place. This term, Year 6 completed their SATs. The children impressed us with their attitude and approach to these tests and we are so very proud of them.

Children in Year 1/2/4 will also be sitting or have sat tests, too. The children in Year 1 will be completing their phonics screen, Year 2 their optional SATS and Year 4 multiplication test. We know the children will complete these in their stride and may not even know they've completed them!

This term we have also had Ofsted visit us. I previously wrote to parents informing them of the inspection and as soon as we have the report.

This last term we have been monitoring pupil punctuality and we are now looking to change the opening arrangements of the school. As a polite reminder, school starts at 8.45am. The top gate is left open for parents to leave site until 8.50am - not for children to arrive. When arriving at school, please can parents use both gates. The gate next to the school office has a large path that parents can come and queue on to keep children and parents off the roadside. Please do walk to the top gate as there is normally fewer people here. When the gates are open, parents need to come in to the playground to say goodbye to their children. Parents waiting at the gate to say good bye and wave, can cause a bottle-neck. Please do come on site and say your goodbyes on the playground. Staff at the gate will remind you to do so.

French Focus Summer 2



Every half term, we are focusing on a different French word or phrase to help us embed key language as well as to use French more frequently, both in the classroom (such as during the register) and around the school more generally. Please find attached to the newsletter an overview for the year.

Our focus for this half term is 'Tu aimes...?' (Do you like...?). This question is answered with 'J'aime... /Je n'aime pas...' (I like.../I do not like...) OR children can simply answer with a thumbs up/thumbs down OR with 'oui' (yes)/'non' (no).
