#### **French Focus Summer 1**



Every half term, we are focusing on a different French word or phrase to help us embed key language as well as to use French more frequently, both in the classroom (such as during the register) and around the school more generally. Please find attached to the newsletter an overview for the year.

Our focus for the coming half term is 'Où habites-tu?' (Where do you live?). This question is answered with 'J'habite à ...' (I live in ...) OR children can simply answer with the name of the place that they live, e.g. 'Tutshill'.

Science Ambassadors have been thinking about Air Quality this half term and we have been tracking the data collated by our new 'buddy' SAMHE.



SAMHE has been tracking the air quality within the Year 5 classroom and we will be using this data to think about how we can improve the air quality in our school. Our second meeting this term has been really interesting and we now know that the CO2 levels peak at 11AM and stay higher than average until 4PM. We are thinking of ways we can reduce this and in turn improve the air quality of our classroom.



After analysing the data and coming to some conclusions, we will be opening our windows during the 30-40 minutes that we are out of the classroom for worship and breaktime and we will then measure the impact this has.
