Medication

We are only able to administer prescribed medication only; prescribed medication needs to be given to Mrs Wellington in the School Office and parents/carers must fill out a medication form to allow us to give your child their medication.

Independence

To enable the children to be as independent as possible in school, please help them at home to zip up coats, put on gloves and tie shoelaces. This will also help us to reduce the amount of lost property!

Due to the weather is changing please can you make sure your child brings in a coat and jumper or cardigan.

Punctuality and School Attendance

As part of our attendance drive, if you arrive after the school gate closes in the morning at 8:45am, you will need to fill out a late slip which you will find in the school office before your child is able to come into school. There were 198 late sessions recorded in term 1. Let's have a better result this term!

Please can we remind parents that we can't accommodate parents coming into classrooms in the morning to drop children off. This is due to safeguarding responsibilities; making sure doors are not opened by anyone other than staff. Please accompany children onto the school playground then the children can walk independently from the pencils to their classrooms.

In accordance with our attendance policy and government guidance, attendance letters were sent out at the end of last term to parents regarding any children that have been absent and are under 94%. All absences count towards the attendance percentage, regardless of whether they are authorised or not. We appreciate that due to the short length of the term even a few days of absence will have caused attendance to fall below 94%, we want to stress that these letters were for information as stated in our policy and that no action will be taken by the school regarding your child's attendance. A big 'thank you' to all of the parents who have been working together with us to ensure our attendance is remains good. 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School Uniform

- KS1 (Reception, Y1 and Y2) daps/black or white trainers.
- KS2 (Y3, 4, 5 and 6) daps/black or white trainers (no colour/logos/names).

Uniform does not have to have the school logo on.
